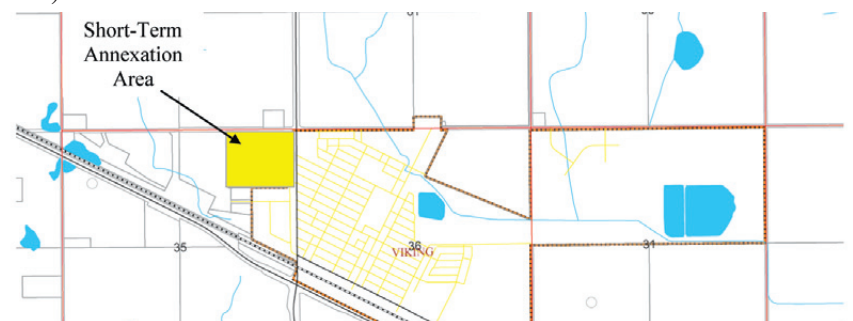

BEAVER COUNTY NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

**For the purpose of hearing arguments for and against proposed amendments to
Beaver County/Town of Viking
Intermunicipal Development Plan Bylaw 08-938**

Beaver County is considering an amendment to the Beaver County/Town of Viking Intermunicipal Development Plan Bylaw 08-938 to add a Short-Term Annexation Area. The Short-Term Annexation Area identifies the primary urban expansion area and will facilitate an application from the Town of Viking to annex 49.55 acres of land for commercial development (as shown below).



Beaver County will hear arguments for or against the proposed amendment at a public hearing scheduled for 10:30 am, Wednesday, May 17, 2017, at the Beaver County Service Centre in Ryley, Alberta.

Copies of the proposed bylaw and amended Intermunicipal Development Plan may be obtained at the Beaver County Office (5120 – 50th Street, Ryley).

Written submissions may be provided to Beaver County Council during the public hearing, however it is requested that a copy of the written submission be delivered to the County Office, attention the Chief Administrative Officer, no later than 4:30 pm, Wednesday, May 10, 2017.

If you submit comments regarding the bylaw in writing, the information you provide may be made public, subject to the provisions of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
