Beaver County Council approved the following roads to be hard surfaced in 2018:

- TWP Rd 492 between Sec. Hwy 854 & RR 181 (4.9 km)
- TWP Rd 510 from Sec. Hwy 833 County Border (1.6 km)
- RR 201 between TWP Rd 510 to HWY 14 (0.5 km)
- TWP Rd 512 between Sec. Hwy 834 to RR 191 (1.7 km)
- RR 191 between TWP 512 to County Border (0.9 km)

2018 Spring Dust Control Program

Beaver County residents desiring an application form for dust control, on the County road adjacent to their property, can call the Beaver County Service Centre to be put on the mailing list.

Residents must apply for dust control by **April 15, 2018** for May/June application to:

The fee will be imposed as a fee-for-service, calculated on the basis of 50% of the cost of the dust suppression product. The County shall provide 50% of the cost per application. Residents that would like a subsequent second application (within the same year) will be required to pay the full cost.

Seniors Can Now Defer Paying Property Taxes

Qualified Seniors Can Now Defer Paying Property Taxes

In 2013, the Alberta Government introduced a Seniors Property Tax Deferral program which will provide eligible seniors with financial support to pay their property tax bill.

This voluntary program will allow seniors to defer their residential property taxes through a low-interest home equity loan with the Alberta Government. The Provincial Government will pay the senior's taxes directly to the municipality and the loan (with interest) will be due when the senior sells his/her home, is no longer eligible for the loan, or earlier if the senior chooses.

You can apply for the SPTDP at any time. However, to allow enough time for your application to be processed and payment forwarded to your municipality (and avoid penalties), you should apply at least 30 days before the property tax deadline.
