

Animal Control

Owning a domestic animal, such as a dog or cat, can be a very satisfying experience, however it is the owner's responsibility to know and understand the rules and regulations of ownership.

Animal Control Bylaw 15-1033 is BeaverCounty's bylaw to regulate and control animals. The intent of the bylaw is to provide residents with a safe community tolive and work.

Any person who contravenes any provision of the bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine.

The easiest way to avoid prosecution under the bylaw is to be a responsible pet owner.





Being a Responsible Pet Owner

- No more than three dogs are permitted per household unless a valid kennel license has been issued
- Ensure your pet is not running at large
- Place a collar on your pet
- Ensure your animal does not become a public nuisance
- Do not untie, loosen or otherwise release an animal which has been tied or otherwise restrained by its owner
- Avoid teasing, tormenting or annoying an animal

Voluntary identification tags are available from the County Office for a one-time fee of \$10. Obtaining a tag will ensure that County officials can locate the owner if an animal is turned in or seized.
