Reeve's Message

It's been a month since the Premier of Alberta announced Phase 2 of Alberta's Relaunch Strategy and as we continue to navigate these unprecedented times, I share with you a cautious excitement of the relaxation of restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We have all felt the impact that the Provincially-mandated limitations placed on our personal lives, social interactions, and workplaces over the last 4 months, but we have weathered this storm together and can now enjoy certain freedoms within a continued framework of proper hygiene and safety protocols.

With respect to County operations, staff have been working in the office from the beginning of the pandemic and will continue to provide the essential services our residents and taxpayers need. For the health and safety of our customers, community, and staff, we are taking all necessary precautions to prevent the spread of the virus and are limiting staff interaction with the public.

For the time being, the County Services Centre remains open to the public with access restrictions. The Services Centre main door is locked, however customers who must conduct business at the Office will be admitted to a maximum capacity of 2 visitors at a time. In-person meetings are limited and must be made by appointment.

I am pleased to announce that on July 17, on-line reservations for group camping at the County's campgrounds will be accepted for arrivals beginning July 24. Playgrounds, beaches, showers, and cookhouses will be available for public use, and I invite you to enjoy these facilities while remaining mindful of the health risk inherent in high-use areas.

The County will be closely monitoring the success of Phase 2 and we look forward to the day when restrictions can be further relaxed. We appreciate your patience and cooperation.

Until that day comes, I encourage you to explore the County's website for a wealth of information regarding our services and partnerships with other organizations, as well as access to on-line forms, notices, etc. Staff are available and happy to assist you by phone or e-mail during regular business hours.

Be encouraged – keep your chin up – and enjoy the summer in our beautiful region.

Range Road 182 and Bruce Update

Very soon our contractor will be applying the first lift of Chip Seal to Range Road 182 and in Bruce where we have cemented the base. The road may be temporarily closed during the application of the Chip Seal.

Following this application, there will be loose rock chips which can damage vehicles, especially at higher travelling speeds. You are encouraged to drive slowly on the fresh chips until the road can be brushed off, or avoid the road altogether.

Please note that these dates are weather dependent and can be affected by changing weather.

During this construction phase, please use another route, or be cautious when you need to drive through construction zones (local traffic only).

Township Road 514 Construction Update

Over the next few weeks, Township Road 514 from Range Road 193 to 195, will be upgraded from a gravel surface to an all-weather hard surfaced road. This involves stabilizing the road base with soil cement before applying two coats of "chip seal". While this process is much different from the process to pave a road with asphalt, the end result will seem similar to residents and the travelling public resulting in a road that is not dusty when it is dry, nor muddy when it is wet.

During this time, the road may be closed to allow crews to work safely; however, access for local landowners will be maintained during construction. There are potential hazards to the public and vehicles during the construction process. This can include heavy machinery, dust or mud, road material such as gravel, asphalt coatings and rock chips.

If possible please use another route, or be cautious when you need to drive through construction zones (local traffic only).
