### Provincial Grant for Road Work

Beaver County Council is pleased to announce that the County has been awarded a grant under the Provincial Government's Municipal Stimulus Program.

This grant has been provided to all Alberta municipalities and is intended to fund new infrastructure projects. Employment and other spin-offs from these projects will help communities recover from the economic challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the downturn in energy prices.

Beaver County's grant is \$701,922 and will be used for rural road rehabilitation, in particular shoulder pulls.

Shoulder pulls are common in rural municipalities to extend the life of a road by reshaping it. Over time, roads tend to flatten and lose their shape (crown). A shoulder pull brings dirt from the ditch bottom and shoulder to the surface of the road, enabling it to be re-contoured to its original specifications.

The locations of the shoulder pulls will be determined by Council at a future date. The work will be undertaken in 2021.

As a team, the Adult Learning Assistant and the Coordinator implement adult programs to support the development of literacy, numeracy, digital, and English language skills in Beaver County.
