Shoulder Pulls

Beaver County will be completing Shoulder Pulls in the following areas over the next few weeks.

- Twp Rd 484 from Hwy 855 to Rge Rd 152
- Twp Rd 492 from Rge Rd 155 to Rge Rd 151
- Twp Rd 500 from Rge Rd 135 to 133
- Twp Rd 490 from Hwy 36 to Rge Rd 122

Road rehabilitation through shoulder pulling will re-establish crown, compact the road surface and allow for grading of the road slope for proper drainage. Although the roads will stay open during construction please expect delays or use alternate routes.

Description of Services (Schedule A)

I. ROOF CLADDING

- Removal and disposal of existing shingles or installation of strapping over existing shingles
- Temporary removal and reinstallation of internet antenna mount
- Supply and installation of 29-gauge metal roof cladding in brown
- Sealing of all roof vents and sky light
- Supply and installation of new brown metal eaves trough and downspouts
- All necessary permits

II. SITE SPECIFICATIONS

- The Camp Lake concession building is a 24 foot by 34-foot brick wall building, with a hip roof consisting of 24-inch eave overhang on all four sides
- Camp Lake is open to guests until September 15th, 2021. The work can start as soon as September 16th, 2021.

Construction Update

Over the summer we have been working to upgrade the following roads:

- **TWP RD 512 from RGE RD 191 to RGE RD 195**
- **RGE RD 202 from TWP RD 504 to TWP RD 510**
- **TWP RD 480 from HWY 36 – RGE RD 132**
- **RGE RD 132 from TWP RD 480 to Parrish & Heimbecker entrance**
- **TWP RD 482 TerraCem REPAIRS from TWP RD 482 to HWY 36**
- **RGE RD 132 TerraCem REPAIRS from P&H north to TWP RD 482**

These locations are starting to receive the second layer of chip seal and there may be delays as work crews direct traffic in order to work safely. There will be many loose rocks after the second chip seal layer is applied and speed limits will continue to be reduced on these roads until the final sweep is complete. Beaver County's goal is to provide a healthy, injury free work environment for all employees, contractors, visitors and general public. There are potential hazards to the public and vehicles during the construction process. This can include heavy machinery, dust or mud, road material such as gravel, asphalt coatings and rock chips.

We apologize for the inconvenience that road maintenance and upgrading causes, but the same roads that receive the most traffic also need the most maintenance. Public Hearing: Surface Drainage Bylaw

Beaver County Council has given first reading to a Surface Drainage Bylaw and is now inviting public input.

The Surface Drainage Bylaw will enable the County to investigate drainage-related complaints wherever the County has jurisdiction over drainage and waterbodies. This applies primarily to the registered subdivisions in Divisions One and Two. Surface water diversions on agricultural lands remain under the jurisdiction of Alberta Environment and Parks and may require an authorization from Alberta Environment and Parks.

The County's Surface Drainage Bylaw prohibits the alteration of the surface elevation or grade of any property (public or private) if such work creates a nuisance or danger, adversely affects the stability of a slope, alters an on-site storm water management system, or alters the elevation of an adjacent property. The Bylaw also restricts naturally occurring drainage features or easements from being filled, drained, or redirected.

Enforcement of the Bylaw includes the power of a County Designated Officer to enter onto the property (after reasonable notice is given) to carry out an inspection and obtain information. The Designated Officer may issue a fine for contravention of the Bylaw and/or may issue an Order to a person to return the property to its original state. The costs incurred for the remediation action are the responsibility of the landowner or the person who caused the contravention.
