In this follow-up presentation to the October 2021 education session by the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR), participants will be led through a more in-depth examination of the components of the Settlement Agreement with a focus on the challenges and successes experienced by Survivors, their families, and communities.

The importance of the stories and experiences collected by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission will be shared as participants examine records from Albertan residential schools.

Participants will learn how to access these stories through a demonstration of the NCTR's database and will be given a tour of how to find resources or documents through the public archive.

### Facilitator Bio:

Steven Greeyes is an Indigenous educator from Muskeg Lake Cree Nation in Saskatchewan.

Steven lives in Winnipeg and has worked in public education and corporate training for over fifteen years. Thanks to his background as a history and native studies teacher, his presentations allow room for conversations and diverse views.

When not at work Steven can be found gardening, harvesting food in his treaty area, dragging his bored children through museums.
