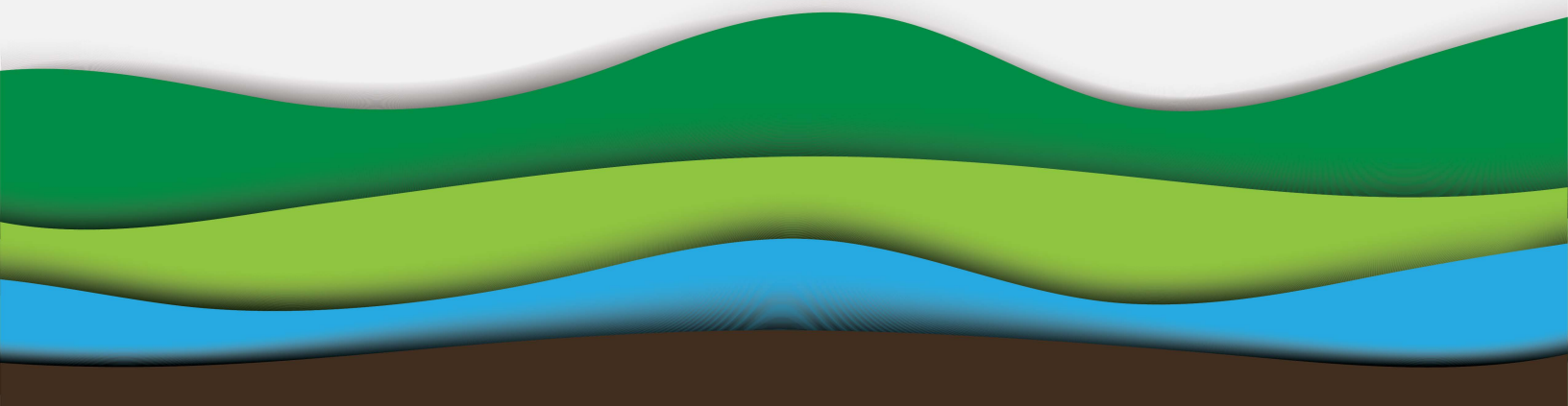

The abundance of land, along with sustainable economic development strategies and the wise use of tax dollars, will attract new businesses and industry to benefit existing companies, provide job opportunities and boost interest in the region. A new seed plant will support the yields of local agricultural producers and offer new niche crop opportunities. A thriving industrial park, as well as a network of greenhouses and cutting-edge agricultural ventures, will support development in the energy, manufacturing, production, agri-food and other economic sectors.

Goal 3: We are seen as leaders in the Capital Region.

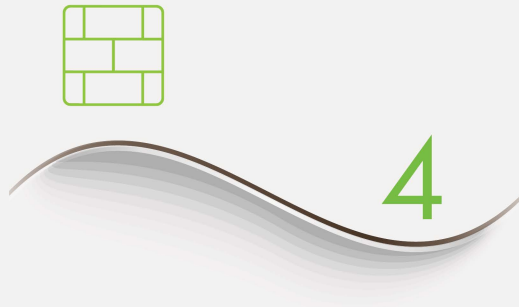
Results

Results

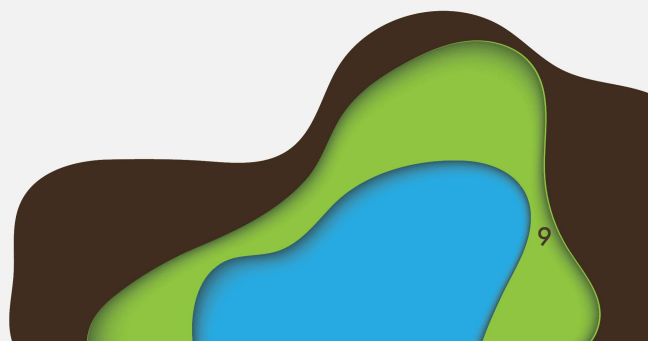
- We have a long-term plan for our road network.

To improve service, Beaver County commits to developing dedicated plans to address road infrastructure and drainage issues across the County. Long-term plans for these issues will establish proactive management processes rather than reactive and identify the most desirable investments and management activities. Overall, investment in infrastructure will balance with costs, preserve the value of assets and provide a standard of service for citizens.
